SHELTER Solano Receives Funding

FAIRFIELD, CA – APRIL 3, 2019: SHELTER Solano has been awarded over five million dollars from the State of California, CAP Solano JPA, and Solano County’s Health and Social Services with additional support from Solano County and its cities and along with Kaiser Permanente, NorthBay Healthcare, Partnership HealthPlan, and Sutter Health.

“We are excited that SHELTER Solano has opened its doors in Solano County,” stated Jerry Huber, Director of Health and Social Services. “And we are thrilled to have an agency with experience in providing a continuum of services to populations that experience homelessness.”

SHELTER Solano is committed to supporting the local community and, in that effort, all of Mission Solano’s current staff were hired on February 1, 2019. Additionally, all received a salary increase due to our commitment to a living wage. The staff, who previously did not have benefits, now also receive full benefits. SHELTER Solano is committed to hiring locally to fill current and future positions.

SHELTER Solano adheres to the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development’s “Housing First” model of low-barrier entrance. SHELTER Solano’s program based model ensures that all those receiving shelter and services will be entered into a program that provides intensive wrap-around services. This best-practices model prepares the guest for success in reaching their goals and permanent housing.

“We are honored to be serving the community in its efforts to prevent and end homelessness in Solano County,” exclaimed John Eckstrom, SHELTER Solano, Inc.’s CEO. “We are confident that our best practices model will assist individuals from returning to the streets.”

SHELTER Solano is serving 50 previously homeless persons at the shelter today and is expecting that number to significantly increase in the coming months as the shelter fully ramps up.
